## What is Shell Recycling?

- The process of collecting, curing, and reusing shells to rebuild, reinforce and maintain natural oyster populations.
  - Also called "Shell Recovery"

Connecticut Public Act 21-24 – Effective in 2021

## My Role: CT Sea Grant Shell Recycling Coordinator

- Provide support and information to existing programs and those seeking to implement one
- Act as liaison between state and local officials
- Identify key players and monitor shell recycling locations throughout CT
  - o CT Shell Recycling Locations
- Create public outreach materials
  - Recycling shells from beaches (mostly Slipper snails) has become a popular topic.
- Identify opportunities for the public to learn about food waste and environmental sustainability







## A bit on recycling shells from beaches...

Beach raking/grading is a CT DEEP approved activity HOWEVER must adhere to proper protocols outlined in:

- CT DEEP's General Permit for Coastal Maintenance
- Connecticut Beach Association's Guide to Coastal Activities and Permitting

CORR may be consulted in these activities as a partner to remove already piled shell but DOES NOT perform the beach raking activities
